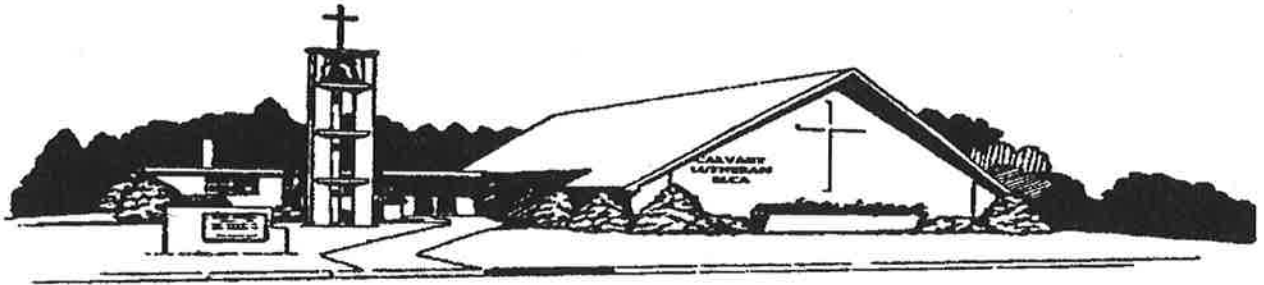

Opening Devotions

Greeting: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you all. **And also with you.**

Dialogue 1 Corinthians 12:12-26 “Unity and Diversity in the Body”

- ¹² Just as a body, though one, has many parts, but all its many parts form one body, so it is with Christ.
- ¹³ **For we were all baptized by one Spirit so as to form one body—whether Jews or Gentiles, slave or free—and we were all given the one Spirit to drink.**
- ¹⁴ Even so the body is not made up of one part but of many.
- ¹⁵ **Now if the foot should say, “Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body,” it would not for that reason stop being part of the body.**
- ¹⁶ And if the ear should say, “Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body,” it would not for that reason stop being part of the body.
- ¹⁷ **If the whole body were an eye, where would the sense of hearing be? If the whole body were an ear, where would the sense of smell be?**
- ¹⁸ But in fact God has placed the parts in the body, every one of them, just as he wanted them to be.
- ¹⁹ **If they were all one part, where would the body be?**
- ²⁰ As it is, there are many parts, but one body.
- ²¹ **The eye cannot say to the hand, “I don’t need you!” And the head cannot say to the feet, “I don’t need you!”**
- ²² On the contrary, those parts of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable,
- ²³ **and the parts that we think are less honorable we treat with special honor. And the parts that are un-presentable are treated with special modesty,**
- ²⁴ while our presentable parts need no special treatment. But God has put the body together, giving greater honor to the parts that lacked it,
- ²⁵ **so that there should be no division in the body, but that its parts should have equal concern for each other.**
- ²⁶ If one part suffers, every part suffers with it; if one part is honored, every part rejoices with it.

Calvary Evangelical Lutheran Church
Annual Meeting
February 7, 2016

The Annual Meeting was called to order by President Bob Diesch at 11:10 am, with 36 voting members in attendance.

The agenda was reviewed and approved by voice vote of the congregation.

Carla Diesch read the minutes from the 2016 Annual Meeting, President Diesch asked if there were any questions or corrections, Pastor asked if it was Taylor or Dana Ziegler that created the Xcel work sheets. Jolene Anderson confirmed that it was Taylor. President Diesch entertained a motion, a motion to approve the minutes was made by Steve Krosch and seconded by Cleo Matzke, motion carried by voice vote of the congregation.

The minutes from the Special Meeting held on December 4, 2016 were read by Carla Diesch, President Diesch asked if there were any questions or corrections, a motion to approve the minutes was made by Scott Kittelson and seconded by Jolene Anderson, motion carried by voice vote of the congregation.

Pastor Suzanne Froelich read her report.

The Financial Report was reviewed by Sara Wingen, Sara forgot to change the dates in the report, but assured us it was the right report. President Diesch entertained a motion to accept the Financial Report, Scott Kittelson made a motion to accept the Financial Secretary's Report and Jolene Anderson seconded the motion. Motion carried by voice vote of the congregation.

Treasure's Report was given by Jolene Anderson. Motion to accept the report by Paulette Nelson, and seconded by Gail Gremel, motion carried by voice vote of the congregation.

President Diesch reviewed the proposed Budget. Pastor's health insurance costs have increased again this year. Motion to approve the Budget made by Steve Krosch and seconded by Iris Nelson.

Old Business: Constitution, President Diesch turned this item over to Dave Reedstrom. Dave went over some highlights in the new Constitution. The new constitution is in compliance with the 2016 Synod Assembly. The synod will be ratifying "blessing" the constitution on February 4, 2017, at which time we will know whether we are good to go, or need additional changes. We currently have 288 confirmed members. On page 17, talks about the officers of the church, Sara Wingen is our financial secretary, however, this position will be on the ballot and voted on each year at the Annual Meeting. 16.04 constitution amendment clause, every three years, makes it easier to approve our constitution. Dave asked for any questions, Steve made mention on page 20 and 21 about the call committee being consisted of 6 voting members, council members are

not eligible to be on the call committee, one council member will be assigned as a liaison only, and won't have any voting rights. Dave also mentioned that we still need the Audit committee to do a check and balance of the financial secretary's books. President Diesch entertained a motion to approve the 2016 constitution, Sara Wingen made the motion and Donna Richards seconded the motion. Motion carried by voice vote of the congregation.

No New Business:

President Diesch commented there is no nomination for President, he asked three times for nominations. No one came forward.

President Diesch asked for nominations for Vice President, he asked three times for nominations, no one came forward.

President Diesch went through the other nominations, Secretary Carla Diesch, Financial Secretary Sara Wingen, and Treasurer Jolene Anderson. Elders, Shelly Wingen for a three year term. Matt's name was missed in the report, he has 2 years remaining. Board of Education - we have three positions open. We have not had a board of education in 30 months. President Diesch asked for nominations for the Board of Education three times, no one came forward. Gustavus Board, president Diesch asked for nominations for the open position. Steve had a question as to whether we need to ask for nomination on positions other than the actual Board, president Diesch indicated that he is hopeful someone will come forward for any of the open positions. Paulette and Lucille will be the nominating committee for 2017. Sheila, Bob and Dave will be the Audit committee for 2017.

Carol Reedstrom asked **IF** she volunteers as President, she still needs someone to volunteer as Vice President. President Diesch once again indicates that the President and Vice President positions are probably the easiest roles on the counsel. The counsel as a whole makes decisions. Sheila Scharping indicated that we have a 2 year burn on our savings account. Carol will be President, and is encouraging someone to be her vice president. President Diesch offered his and Dave's experience as help to anyone who volunteers. Erica Kittelson volunteered to be vice president. Wendy Howieson volunteered for the Gustavus position. President Diesch entertained a motion. Motion made by Iris Nelson, and seconded by Lucille Doss. Motion carried by voice vote of the congregation.

President Diesch entertained a motion to adjourn. Motion made by Scott Kittelson and seconded by Sara Wingen, motion carried, meeting adjourn at 12:08 pm

Interim Pastor's Annual Report 2017 for Calvary Lutheran Church

Dear friends, grace to you and peace from God our Father and our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen

A time of transition for Calvary began this past September as you bid farewell to Pastor Suzannè Froelich. We remember her with fondness and thank God for her ministry and her faithfulness to the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ. We give thanks for her message that was proclaimed in Word and service. It was a grace filled message centered on a relationship with our Lord, and of all the promises He offers. And, as members of the body of Christ, it was also a message of grace as you worked together in worship, study, and pray in this community of faith.

In November the interim period began in earnest when I joined you as your Interim Pastor. I give thanks to God for your hospitality and your graciousness. Together, it's by His grace that we begin this journey of reflection to discover (rediscover) who we are, whose we are, and who we desire to be within the body of Christ. Together, we will continue to dream dreams and prepare the future.

On December 19th, Council members formally signed a covenant with the SE MN Synod to embark on a new program called "*Hope in Christ*". Designed as a tool for transitional congregational, this program is will engage a congregation in conversation about its ministry within the church as well as the surrounding community. The Synod has contracted with Pastor Peter Soli, from Albert Lea, MN, to guide us as we discern our future options in ministry. The Council intends to keep everyone informed as we move through our study, and will provide opportunities for conversations as they arise.

Members of Calvary's Guide Team are: Bob Diesch, Lucille Doss, Scott Kittleson, Paulette Nelson, Heather Pasbrig and Brian Tryhus, with Carol Reedstrom and Pr. Gerry Giese as advisors. May the Holy Spirit guide each of us as we move forward in this transitional study.

The focus of "*Hope in Christ*" will be, "Where is God leading us in the next chapters of our ministry together?" Keeping this question in the forefront essentially enables us to focus our direction on our future ministry. Do you remember this question I posed to you this fall, "What is God 'up to' at Calvary and the Rapidan area?" I anticipate this question to be answered by our responses to:

1. Who are we?
2. What is our mission?
3. How are we going to accomplish this mission?
4. What are our resources?

At the end of our study period, we will begin to discern Calvary' options for ministry. As I shared with the church council, essentially there are three options to explore.

- I. **Solo Pastorate:** Part Time – The income expense at ½ approximate expense. Circumstance and questions for **Part Time Pastorate** ministry for solo pastorate would be:
 - a) The structure of our ministry would be determined by the ministry needs of the congregation. This would be the task of the council, the Guide Team, the congregation members and for me as your interim to explore what that structure may look like.
 - b) It is vital to include conversations with members of the congregation. This may include conversations after church while we have our fellowship hour, special called town hall meetings at the church or perhaps group meetings in a member's home.

- c) Together, as I participate with you in your ministry, we can begin to discern what part time ministry may consist of and are the members supportive of the proposals that are being considered?
- d) For Part Time Solo Pastorate: The question for our synod staff would be: Are there candidates who would be interested in a part-time term call.

* The same conversations of (Part I – a, b & c) would also be the focus for conversation with Part II and III.

II. **Two-Point Configuration:** Partner with a similar congregation.

- a) There are several congregations in our immediate area that have the possibility of partnering within a Two-Point configuration. Before we can consider and establish contact, we would work through the same process as Part I.
- b) Before partnering with area congregation, we would be in contact with the Synod staff through Pastor Susan Miller. Her role is to offer guidance regarding protocol for such a contact. At that point we could begin conversations with a congregation and possibly form a joint task force with the potential partner congregation. This task force would identify the context of each congregation's ministry and establish the potential context of a two-point parish ministry. Areas of study would evolve around worship, pastoral care, organizational ministry, and a time schedule based upon the needs of each congregation, to name a few.
- c) There are several Lutheran congregations in our area (SE MN Synod).
- d) There is one possibly two in (SW MN Synod)
- e) There is one ecumenical possibility in our immediate area.

III. **Partner with Larger Congregation:** Contract configuration.

- a) There are several larger congregations in our immediate area that are possibilities to partner within a **Contract** configuration. Before we can consider and establish contact, we would work through the same process as Part I & II.
- b) For partnership with area congregation we would once again be in contact with the synod staff through Pr. Miller. She would offer guidance in protocol for contact. (The protocol for conversations with a larger congregation would be the same as Part II. b)
- c) There are several Lutheran congregations in our area (SE MN. Synod).
- d) For example: Pr. Scott Olson of Grace LC gave a presentation to the church council on their partnership with Redeemer, Beauford.

Let me to take this opportunity to thank each and every one of you for your commitment to the ministry that takes place within Calvary and the community that surrounds us. I would also sincerely like to thank you for your prayers and support during this interim time. And lastly, thank you for the opportunity to serve you and your ministry.
