

A Message from Pastor Dave:

Grace to you and peace from God Our Father and our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

The Epiphany of Our Lord (the official date of the festival of Epiphany is January 6). The word "epiphany" comes from the Greek root epiphaneia, meaning "to show forth, appear or manifest." During this season, we celebrate Christ's being shown forth among us as human—as Emmanuel, "God-with-us," --Christ's appearance in the world, and Christ's manifestation as Lord. The festival of Epiphany takes place after the "twelve days of Christmas" (December 25-January 5), and begins with an ancient celebration that draws together several different themes: the birth and baptism of Jesus, the coming of the Magi (wisemen/kings), and of Jesus' turning water into wine at Cana in Galilee—his first miracle. This season after Epiphany lasts until Ash Wednesday, and serves as a bridge between Jesus' birth and his passion; between Christmas and Lent. It is in this time that we celebrate the expressions of both Jesus' humanity and his divinity. The Festival of Epiphany marks the coming of the Magi to greet the child Jesus. They bring with them gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh.

Special emphasis is placed on Epiphany as a time of celebration—which seems a bit lost in our culture. We spend so much energy preparing for Christmas and the birth of Christ that the celebration of Epiphany and the manifestation of Jesus as Lord in our lives seems diminished. Yet, we should not neglect the deep meaning that this festival has for our worship and congregational life. We are called in this Epiphany season to remember the manifestation of Jesus as Lord, to celebrate God's incarnation as a human being in Jesus Christ, with all of humanity's vulnerabilities. We are called to follow in Jesus' footsteps—to aid those who live in distress, to help those who experience hunger, sickness, and isolation, and to champion the justice of God. This is the call of Jesus Christ made manifest as Lord. In this Epiphany season, let us heed God's call to faithful service, that Christ our Lord may be glorified in this place.

God's peace to you this Epiphany season.

Want to know a little more about our Sunday School teachers, Cleo Matzke and Tanya Junker?

Tanya: Tell us a bit about yourself.

I live in rural Lake Crystal with my husband and two children. I work full-time and enjoy spending any time I am not at work with my family. I was raised, baptized, and confirmed Catholic and later converted to Lutheran.

Tanya: How do you engage children in your class?

I use short videos and games to reinforce the Sunday School Lesson. I try to use examples that children can relate to; to help them understand complex lessons.

Tanya: Tell us about a funny experience with your students.

When we learned about the 10 commandments, we had a fun game using pictures of celebrities. Children placed the celebrities on a wall with those that were most important to them at the top. There was some argument on where Elon Musk, Mr. Beast, and Superman should be ranked. Pastor Dave ranked higher than Santa Claus. Then we placed a cross with the word GOD on top and explained the first commandment.

Tanya: What excites you and motivates you to teach Sunday school?

I enjoy designing the lessons and finding fun ways to reinforce lessons.

Cleo: Tell us a bit about yourself.

I grew up in rural Sleepy Eye on a farm and attended a one room country school for grades one through six with one teacher. Back then there was not any kindergarten. The whole school had a student population of between 15-20 students depending on the year with my class having two students in it. As soon as I had somewhat mastered reading and math I was able to help the younger students in these subject areas. That is when my love of teaching began. After high school graduation I attended Augustana College in Sioux Falls, SD obtaining a degree in elementary education. My teaching career spanned over 38 years with 35 of those years teaching second grade which I totally enjoyed.

Cleo: How do you engage children in your class?

You have to keep the pace moving in Sunday School in order to keep the students' attention. Students have to be able to relate to what you're teaching and be able to apply the lesson to their lives. I like to incorporate role playing and problem solving into the lessons. We talk about how the week at school went and if anyone had any difficulties which need to be addressed.

Cleo: What gives you joy as a Sunday school teacher?

Seeing the children coming into the classroom with smiles on their faces and enthusiasm in their voices gives me joy. The students are quick to remember something we've done in the past and are wondering if we could do that again. The class time seems to fly by and often someone will say "It can't be over already."

Cleo: Tell us about a funny experience with your students.

A funny experience was when we were making angels and we talked about angels coming to speak to Jesus. I asked the students what they thought an angel would say if an angel came to any of them. One said if an angel did come it would have to be a Paw Patrol angel.

Cleo: What is your favorite book and why?

I have many favorite books such as Where the Red Fern Grows and Love You Forever, but a book I found so very deeply touching was "Clouds: A Memoir" by Laura Sobiech. In this book she tells of the journey of losing her son Zach to cancer and how the family's faith helped give them strength. Their son Zach wrote the song Clouds as a way to say goodbye to his family and friends.

Cleo: What excites you and motivates you to teach Sunday school?

I want our children to know that the church is their "church family" and that they can look to us for love and support. I would hope that by strengthening their faith their self-confidence will grow to make good life choices, desire to obey rules and be an asset to society.
